National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs and Special Milk Programs

The Center for Educational Opportunities (CEO) announces that all enrolled students have become eligible for a daily breakfast and lunch free of charge as per the recently approved Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP). These CEO and ETC student benefits have been approved for all students beginning during the 2017-18 school year and will continue through the end of the 2020-21 school year. As such all students will have the opportunity to order a free breakfast and lunch upon entering the CEO school building each day of attendance at no cost. In addition, each student will receive the following notice (click on the link) mailed to their household as per the CEP Grant Compliance Agreement.
